The Life of Grace, Hospice, Dementia and the Resurrection

Part -2 (these articles are to serve two purposes, to allow you a glimpse into Grace Brouwer's life and to show Christ.)

When Joanne and I were courting, I would have coffee with Grace every morning before she and I both went to work. She and I both had to be in early for work, so she invited me to start coming for coffee and breakfast every morning. Many times, my beautiful, better half, Joanne would make breakfast. Through those many mornings and so many other settings, a deep friendship procured.

Many times, Grace asked me many spiritual and theological questions when she was getting to know me. It was never judgmental, I never felt pressured. She showed that she wanted me to have a deepening relationship with the Lord Jesus, simply put she cared. I loved our conversations and her stories.

I remember the day Grace told me about her first husband.

"My first husband Ray died. Ray was the best mechanic anyone could go to in the area, he ran his own business, and he was very, very Protestant Reformed. He was kind and sweet. But most of all he was such a talker and very funny. I loved him.

"What Happened?" I replied.

"I was 28 and it had been 3 years since we had been married. We had just moved to Colorado. We both loved the mountains, camping, we were very adventurous. We were the kind of people that loved the wind in our hair, to have fun, we went to church every Sunday and I even used to smoke."

Joanne interrupted, "Mom! You smoked?! How come you never told me?!"

Grace said, "I didn't keep it from you, I just never found the right time. So much about life is timing. Don't worry I think your ready now. Besides, it was a dumb thing to do. Don't go doing it." Joanne gave a slight funny glance of disapproval, I smiled and laughed. Joanne and I had such a hard time imagining her smoking, but many people smoked back then.

Grace continued, "Anyway, Ray and I worked hard. We finally got some time off and we were going to live it up. We took one motorcycle. Some guy came around the corner and didn't see us. Right along the road on the mountainside, we hit the rock-wall. Next thing I knew I woke up in the hospital. It happened so fast. My knee and parts of my tibia, fibula and femur were shattered. Doctors explained to me days later that my leg was the first successful experimental surgery of its kind. I was put in medical books."

Joanne and I could tell that Grace did not struggle telling us about her accident or her leg. But her lips trembled at what came next.

"He didn't make it. He was dead on impact. I never said goodbye."

"What happened? What did you do?" I asked.

"Well, it was awful." Grace sighed, "I woke up and everything I knew was gone. All my hopes and dreams were dead because they were all made with him in mind." Tears came down her face, "I shouldn't cry. I'm so old and it happened so long ago. I was stuck there in a hospital for a month. I had to learn to walk again. I felt numb. Helpless. Hopeless. Nothing seemed to matter anymore. It was a dark time for me. How do you learn to walk again when you're not sure you want to breathe again? I couldn't stop crying. Even years later I couldn't just stop it, the floodgates just came. Things just triggered it. I never got to see his body. I was told that he was unrecognizable. There was a funeral, I couldn't go to it, I was in a coma.

"The devil seemed to have won at that time in my life. I wish I could tell you I believed in the sovereignty and perfect plan of God at that time. The truth is I couldn't understand how a good God could do this to me and Ray. The day I left the hospital I picked up only a few things from my apartment. I put them in a car and headed back to Chicago to live with my folks.

"A year later, I went to a large, secluded park in the middle of the night. It was probably illegal, but no one was there. I went there to talk to God for what I thought was the last time. I shook my fist at him. I yelled at him. I let him have it. It was the first time I had talked to God since the accident. It happened on the anniversary of his passing.

"After that I said to myself, I was done believing in God. I was wrong. That night, I had a dream. The Lord spoke powerfully to me through that dream. It was the first time in my life I had a dream like that. It felt so real. In the dream God said I would see my husband again. He also corrected me and told me not to give up. Boy, was I ready to give up. But God was not going to give up on me. That was the first time in my life that I took the resurrection seriously. God overturns death.

"I also learned something that seems to be hard for stubborn people like me to learn. I don't have to understand why everything happens. Who said you have a right to know? The Bible doesn't teach that. But neither is there anyone on earth nor is there any philosophy that can prove that I have a right to know why things happen the way they do.

"Has that ever occurred to you? We waste so much of our lives being so angry when that is exactly where the devil wants us. That's his strategy. To keep us trapped in our pain and suffering.

"That dream, but more so, the Bible and hope of the resurrection taught me how to live free from the devil's strategy. If death is conquered, and If I am already receiving eternal life and a new body then what am I complaining about? If I get to spend eternity with Ray, Christ, and all my loved ones that have gone before me, then why do I waste my time living in the past if I have eternity ahead of me? This life is as small as the period at the end of a sentence.

"It is not that this life is not important, it is that this life is not all that there is. So now I'm living for eternity because I trust in the sovereignty of God. I figure I can spend the rest of my life, living like I'm dying, I can end up in a ditch somewhere or I can live with the promises of God. I do not have to deny what happened. I simply must accept it. Then say, Okay God. You are using this for a purpose. Now, what is next?

"Everyone's journey is different. But the goal is always the same. Unfortunately, too many stop at feeling sorry for themselves and never move on. That is the wide path. Not the narrow. Again, it is the wide path that the Devil wants you on. Choose the narrow path, that leads to blessing.

"His promise to me and all of us is that we will see the reversal of all that is wrong made right. Do you know what this means? I won't have to deal with this stump of a leg anymore. I won't have to cry anymore because of the pain in my chest every time memory haunts me. Though death has stolen from me, Christ purchased Ray and me at the cross that we might be restored. I will walk again with a new leg, with Christ and Ray."

These talks with Grace, meant so much because she was trying to teach me about the most important things in life. Loss, grief, love, and the power of the resurrection. She knew so well that Joanne and I would need these teachings to be able to grow into mature Christians. These were not just some nice coffee chats with my future mother-in-law. I was being given gospel truth to live a gospel shaped life.

I was already a Christian, but she was ministering to my soul, nonetheless.

 - If there is a Severe Weather Warning, each group holding a meeting should appoint someone to monitor weather information. For a worship service, the Council will appoint someone to monitor this information.
 - o If there is a Tornado Watch, that is an announcement that weather conditions are such that there is the possibility of tornadoes in the area, all meetings and services will be canceled, unless the watch is lifted one hour prior to the meeting. (For example: the tornado watch must be lifted by 9:00am or the morning worship service will be canceled.) Every effort will be made to post the closing on WOOD-TV (Channel 8) and on WZZM-TV (Channel 13), as well as via our texting and email services.
 - If there is a Tornado Warning or Alert during the service or meeting, the service or meeting will be canceled immediately, and everyone will be asked to take immediate shelter
