Devotion: Sanctity of Human Life

The phrase "sanctity of life" reflects the belief that, because people are made in God's image (Genesis 1:26–27), human life is **sacred**. The sanctity of human life is sourced in being made in the image of God, which is set apart from all other forms of life. As image bearers of God, we are to be respected and protected. God gave humanity the authority to kill and eat other forms of life (Genesis 9:3). However the taking of another human life is forbidden by the Lord (Genesis 9:6).

Sacred and sanctity are linguistic forms of the word holy, which is to be special and set apart. Human life is not holy in the same sense that God is holy. Only God is holy in and of Himself. Human life is only holy in the sense that we have been "set apart" from all other life created by God. Second, human life is sacred in that God himself has delegated and bestowed some of His own holiness unto us through being made in His image.

Although humanity was created in God's image, sin has corrupted that image. The sanctity of human life is not because we are such wonderful and good people. The image of God has been marred by sin, but His image is still present in humanity. We are made in the likeness of God, and that likeness means that human life is always to be treated with dignity and respect.

Many apply the sanctity of life to issues like abortion and euthanasia, and, while it applies to those issues, it applies to so much more. The sanctity of life should motivate us to combat all forms of evil and injustice that are perpetuated against human life. Violence, abuse, oppression, human trafficking, and many other evils are also violations of the sanctity of life. Seeing to the needs of the elderly and sick is also a part of the sanctity of human life.

The sanctity of life is a theological truth, but love must be the motivation and the balance of pursuing to encourage the sanctity of human life in all areas of life.
